### Heirs to a King

(The following story is taken from the Stewardship newsletter.)

Once upon a time, everyone in a town talked about being average, but no one really thought they were, there lived a man who amazed his neighbors by what he said about his children. He was like other people, yet different. When he first moved in, his neighbors thought him to be ordinary enough. He went to work. He moved his lawn. He took his children to the circus. But the more they saw and the more they heard, the more they realized that here was something different about his man...and his children. There was a loyalty and unity and purpose that set them apart. **They lived as though they were accountable to someone.** They were part of the community, and yet belonged beyond it, like folks on a visit or travelers passing through.

About time, for instance; the neighbors gradually noticed that this man and his family had a concept of time different from theirs. In the first place, he planned his leisure time to include his family. They seemed to have so much fun together, going on picnics, taking trips to places of interest, attending concerts or good movies. The neighbors envied his family life. They couldn't seem to find time for their families to do things together.

Secondly, the man took time for God. Each day he and his family had devotions together and the way they talked about God and the Bible was natural and familiar – the way one talks about a friend dearly loved and a book one knows and enjoys. This man's children loved their school. Also, they were always working on some mission

project they had studied or writing to someone overseas. You see this man took time to work in the church and his interest rubbed off on his children. He attended services and taught a class in religion. For him and his family, the church was a center of activity. In civic affairs too, he always gave time and support to worthwhile enterprises. The neighbors learned that to this man time was a trust for which he held himself accountable. He had time for what was good. He had no time to waste.

He really was just an ordinary fellow, but there was a "glow" about him. Someone said, "Whosoever would kindle another, must himself first glow." He wasn't a talented speaker, but when he taught his religion class, or when he just talked to another, he made the person feel that he wanted to live a better life. He must have made his children feel that way too. They were normal enough and full of pep, but they were conscientious about preparing their lessons in school and they worked hard to develop their talents. Yet they weren't a bit conceited. They acted as if they were accountable for their abilities and that doing less than their best would be letting someone down.

You see, this man talked about the use of time and talents as a "stewardship" and there was that "glow" about him when he did so. No one in town had ever thought of stewardship that way. They considered it a means the church used to get money. But the way this man put it was different. He really believed that stewardship related to every area of life. He said, **"Stewardship is not people's plan for making money, but God's plan for making people."**

He carried through this idea of stewardship in his giving too. His salary wasn't any larger than his neighbors', but his gifts were. He gave a certain percentage of his income to the church. He called it proportionate giving. His children were trained to give that way too. He didn't give them each a nickel on Sunday morning the way the neighbors did. He taught them to tithe their allowance and earnings. They divided this tithe so that they gave part in church and the rest to their special mission projects. They seemed to have fun planning how to split it. They handled money as though they were accountable to God for the way they used it.

One day a townsman asked this man how he could be so patient, so firm and clear with standards in the training of his children. It was his answer to this question that amazed the townsman most of all; for this is what he said: "I carry a secret that perhaps you did not know. These are not really my children. They are the children of a King – my King! It is my privilege to bring them up for him. Why shouldn't I be patient? Why shouldn't I have standards for them beyond this town? They are heirs of the Kingdom. In all they do, they must be an honor to the King."

He looked like an ordinary person. In many ways he was an ordinary man. But he was different.

I wonder if this is part of our struggle as people living in this world, we are taught that the only one we have to be accountable to is ourselves. How untrue. We struggle managing our time, our resources, and our priorities. We need to be accountable to God - the rest will follow. We need to be accountable to God with our time, our resources, our energy, our self. We have lost that image of what it means to be a subject to a king, maybe we need to regain that mindset, so to lift-up our King, honor and worship our King, and live our lives accountable to God, our King.

The worldly examples of "heirs" are people like Paris Hilton (wealth), Barry Bonds (talent), and others - and they do not seem to be accountable to anyone for the gifts given them, they act as if the world has been created for them. It has not. They do not provide us with good examples.

We are heirs - to the King. And in that, we are accountable to our King, the King of the universe. We have been created to live in this world, but to be different (holy). God has claimed us to be his own, his own family. Remember who you represent in our world and to whom you are accountable – a loving, giving, and forgiving God.

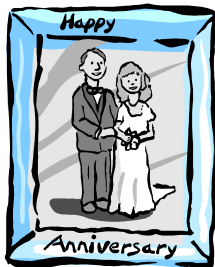

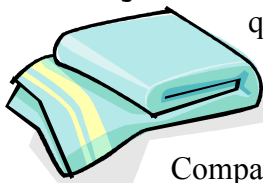
## One In Christ Lutheran Parish VBS "Take the Plunge"

We were blessed! We had a great week! A lot of energy and enthusiasm by the kids, dedicated staff, and great weather. This continues to be a wonderful cooperative effort to bring the message and promises of Jesus into the lives of our young people.

**VBS: Thank you** to all those who donated supplies for Vacation Bible School. Thank you to all those who gave of their time and energy this past week teaching and staffing Vacation Bible School. We had over 120 children attending and over 50 adults/youth helping (*confirmation age youth up and through the grandma ages helping and enjoying the experience*), including Pastor Tim Miller (Our Savior's and West Prairie) who moved in on June 2<sup>nd</sup>, had his first worship on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and then spent the week at VBS.. A great week!

**VBS Project Mission Projects:** We made quilts for Guatemala, our monetary offerings will be used to support two children through Compassion International and we were collecting supplies to assemble health kits (*The kids decorated bags to hold the health kit supplies.*). **We are still in need of 25 nail clippers w/files and about 30 bath towels to complete our goal of 50 health kits.** If you can help, please bring any of these items to your respective church office. ## Natural Church Development VISIONING PROCESS

The parish council has been working with the synod staff and talking with our congregation councils to modify a process called "Natural Church Development" that has proven insightful and effective in many congregations.

**What is Natural Church Development?** It is about *church health*. It is about *releasing the God-given gifts* to the church. It is about creatively, authenticity, and *diversity*. And it is all based on *Biblical principles*.

This began with a research project done by Christian Schwarz observing what similar characteristics can be found in healthy, growing churches. Schwarz recognized early in his work that there are many *models* of church growth which churches are called upon to imitate. Many of these models are the so-called "megachurches" which have had outstanding success in church growth. Schwarz recognizes that while we have much to learn from these models, they do not fit all churches. His research project focuses on the *principles* inherent in successful churches, which he analyzes according to both quality and numerical growth patterns.

Schwarz identifies 8 quality characteristics which, when *all* present to a sufficient degree will practically *guarantee* numerical growth. These characteristics are as follows:

1. Empowering leadership
2. Gift-oriented ministry
3. Passionate spirituality
4. Functional structures
5. Inspiring worship service
6. Holistic small groups
7. Need-oriented evangelism
8. Loving relationships

We are working with our synod staff and Natural Church Development to develop this tool to serve the "parish setting" and we now have a model around which to shape our process. To be effective, we will need to engage the whole parish, each congregation, and committed individuals to get a good look at ourselves. *I encourage you, if you are asked, to participate prayerfully.*

Use these two tools to remind and challenge yourself for the next 40 days. **Sunday, July 15<sup>th</sup>** is **“Go and Do Likewise”** Sunday – this theme is based on the Good Samaritan story from Luke 10:25-37. We will use this Sunday to lift-up the ELCA World Hunger Appeal. July 15<sup>th</sup> is the day we ask you to bring your banks to church (*there will be offering envelopes distributed and available as well*).

The theme of this years Northeastern Iowa Synod Assembly was

**Living in God’s Amazing Grace  
Thanks be to God!**

**Ending Hunger Now**

Our keynote speaker was Kathryn Sime, director of the World Hunger Appeal and Disaster Appeal for the ELCA. Through the speakers, one minute skits, and various workshops we were reminded of this ongoing and crucial need in our world. And the real possibility that in this day and age “hunger can actually be eliminated” if we choose to make that a priority and serious work at it – individuals and governments.

I encourage you to set up some type of discipline for the month that will challenge you to give to the hunger needs of the world. Develop a plan, a system, a challenge for the next 40 days to raise a hunger awareness in your household. Maybe plan to give a quarter a day. Or contribute \$.10 for every pop you buy or a nickel for every cup of coffee you drink. Or \$5 for every time you go out to eat. Set-up something that works for you, that challenges you, that makes you think what it means to be a neighbor to the world around us. And then on Sunday, July 15<sup>th</sup>, we will bring our collection boxes and offerings to church and lift-up that theme **“Go and Do Likewise”**.

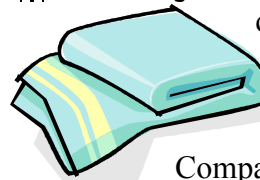

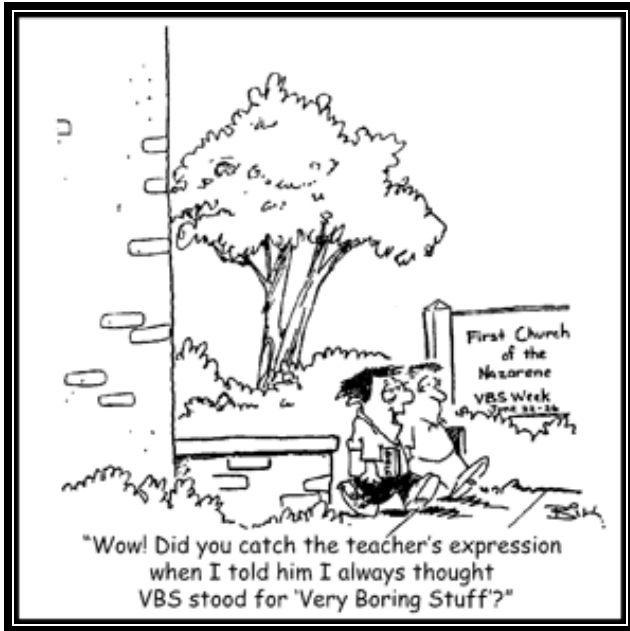
